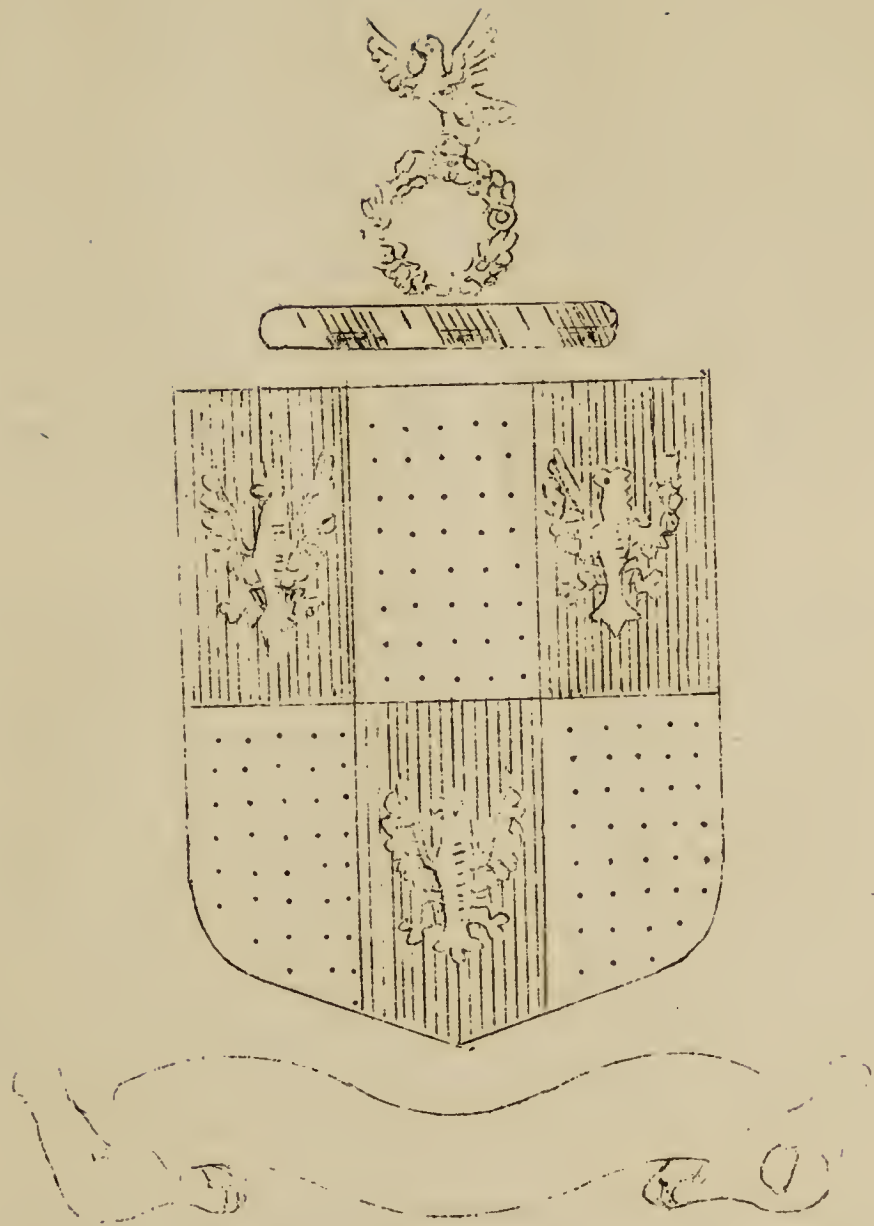

I N T R O D U C T I O N

This genealogy was begun about five years ago, merely as a record of our own branch of the family, and data regarding its generations gathered here and there; from Virginia records, various books, William & Mary Quarterlys, etc. Locally, we had Bible records, tombstones, county records, and statements from various relatives, much being told (regarding her own generation, and later ones) by Mrs. Julia Fenelope (Steger) Von Manston, who has recently died. As usually happens in genealogical research, we began to learn more about the other branches, and connecting families, until in the early fall of 1929, realizing the extent of the collection, we felt possibly enough other members of the family might be interested to justify making a record in a more permanent form; the expense of printing was too great for the limited demand, so it was decided to mimeograph it.

Our greatest ambition has been to make the record complete-- and correct, and to make no positive statements for which we had no good authority. We feel that we have succeeded, as nearly as anyone could. There are some lines which seem, at this time, to be hopelessly "lost" as no one we can find knows what became of these particular persons; many Madison Countians went to Mississippi, Arkansas, Texas, and other states during the financial depression of the 1840's, and lost touch with their relatives. All other lines are not brought down to date, as many of our letters of inquiry were returned from addresses given us, undelivered; other letters went unanswered; but we cannot express our gratitude to the majority who co-operated so heartily, and furnished all the information they could.

For the older generations, who were pioneer citizens of Madison County, we have our county records, etc. as proof for our statements, but for the later generations, and those living away from here, we have relied on the charts sent by living descendants. Occasionally data sent by different members of the same family varied slightly-- in these cases we have had to make a choice as best we could.

The book is roughly divided into three parts. The first being the royal descent, old wills, and so forth, the second the descendants of the four children of Benjamin and Ann (Eppes) Harris whom we have tried to trace, and the third, allied families and material received too late to go in its proper place.

We regret that we cannot give anything on the ancestry of Ben-

jamin Harris; some of the descendants think he himself came from England but this is by no means certain. There is a very old Harris family in Virginia, and one Sarah Harris, who belonged to it, and died in Cumberland Co., Va. ~~1753~~ mentions her brother Benjamin Harris, but we have no reason to believe that this was our Benjamin; so many persons bore the same name that it frequently takes a great deal of research to determine which is which and so far we have not been able to visit the Virginia county seats long enough to go into the records thoroughly.

It has not been possible to index each name in the book, but it is arranged so that it is very easy to follow any certain line either forward or back; and where we had any data regarding families intermarrying with ours, it has been placed in the last section, and is shown in the Table of Contents.

Genealogy is a most interesting study. If a child knows that he has worthy forefathers he will try to grow to their measure, perhaps. And if he sits down and calculates that by the law of arithmetical progression, doubling each generation, (with no intermarriages of relatives), that forty generations ago (from the latest arrival to Charles Martel) he had over five billion ancestors he isn't apt to become too boastful of the ones who can be traced.

Compiling this record has given us a great deal of pleasure: we hope that its possession will afford you as much.

The ISHAM Family

The name of the family is said to have been derived from the estate and to have been written "de Isham" until the time of Robert de Isham, 1424, who discarded the "de".

Henry Isham, born 1627, came to Virginia and became a merchant at Bermuda Hundred on the James River. He was Justice of Charles City County in 1657, Captain and High Sheriff of Henrico County from 1669 to 1670; married Katherine Banks, widow of Joseph Royall. In her will dated Dec. 1636 she leaves residue of her money to daughters Mary Randolph and Ann Epes; to each two silver salt cellars; to grandson Isham Eppes, a negro; to daughter Ann Epes a seal ring, a pair of silver clasps and a silver bodkin; her son Joseph Royall and son in law Francis Epes executors. The children of Katherine Banks and Henry Isham were Henry Isham, died unmarried; Mary Isham, 1660-1735, married 1680 William Randolph of Turkey Island;

Ann Isham, married Col. Francis Eppes III

Isham Arms. (Northampton) Gules three piles wavy or, over all a forse of the second.

BRETT LINE

Alexander Brett of Whitstanon and Devon a cousin of Sir Walter

Raleigh, married 1568, Elizabeth, daughter of Rosmaderos, an heiress, and had issue John; Robert; of Lincolnshire; citizen and merchant of London, gent. who married Elizabeth, daughter of Edward Bush of Sison 3rd brother of the Bushes of Hobun; Symon.

Robert and Elizabeth (Bush) Brett had issue; Robert, married Elizabeth daughter of Reginald Highgate; Margaret, married Veale.

Robert and Elizabeth (Highgate) Brett had issue; John; William, of Toddington, Bedfordshire; Robert; Richard; Elizabeth and Catherine.

William Brett, of Toddington had issue; Sir Edward, born 1608; Mary, who married William Isham.

Brett Arms. (Whitstanton, Devonshire.) Argent seme of crosses crosslets; fitchie a lion rampant gules.

-EPPES FAMILY

Lt. Colonel Francis Eppes (called Captain Eppes elsewhere) obtained a grant of land August 26, 1636, for transportation of himself, his three sons and some 30 servants into the Virginia Colony, and in 1635 settled there on the south shore of the James River near the mouth of the Appamatox. This river formed the boundary line between the southern halves of the counties of Henrico and Charles City, which then lay on both sides of the James River; and as Colonel Eppes subsequently acquired very extensive estates in both counties he was returned to the House of Burgesses indifferently from either. Sometime previous to his death which occurred in 1655 he became a member of the Colonial Council. Four of his descendants in lineal succession, each bearing the name Francis and three of them distinguished by the title of Colonel, all county officials and Members of the House of Burgesses, enjoyed in tail male the large landed estates the first Francis had secured in that part of the County of Henrico which was subsequently made Chesterfield. The lands in and around City Point which were granted in 1636 are still owned by the Eppes family; it is said that no other tract of land in America has been so long in unbroken possession of one family. Francis Eppes I was Lt. Colonel of the County, member of the House of Burgesses 1625-1632; Commissioner 1631-39, Member of the Council April 30, 1652. His son Lt. Col. Francis Eppes II of Henrico Co., Va. was born 1628, and died in 1678. He was Lt. Colonel of the County Militia and in 1677 was Commissioner. He married 1 _____ and had Francis Eppes III, and later married Elizabeth Littlebury, widow of William Worsham, by whom he had Mary, born 1664 married 1685 Lt. Col. John Hardiman; William, Littleberry. Francis Eppes II. was killed by the Indians. His verbal will was supposed 1678; mentions wife and four children; hoped brother would settle one of them at Cawson's, Henrico Co. Witnesses were Richard Cocke and William Randolph who were with him in his last illness. Conversation took place with Col. Randolph several days before his death, while he was lying wounded. In the inventory of his home in Henrico Co., then a frontier, a "suit of

tapestry hangings" valued at 18, 17 s is mentioned.

Descriptions of Coats of Arms.

Eppes: Arms. Per fesse gules and or, a pale counterchanged, three eagles displayed of the last. Crest; on a chaplet vert flowers, a falcon rising of the last.

Col. Francis Eppes III. born 1659, married 1685 Anne Isham; his will dated Jan. 1718-19 and proved 1720. He was sworn Justice of Henrico June 1, 1683; Sheriff 1685-1686-1691-1692-1698-1710-1711 and a Burgess in 1702-03 and April, 1704. Their children were Francis, m. Sarah; Captain Isham, died unmarried 1717; William, Anne, married William Kennon; Elizabeth, married Henry Randolph; Mary, and Sarah. Colonel Francis Eppes IV was Justice in 1710 and in March 1719-20 and was appointed Trustee of the House of Burgesses 1712-13-14 and died 1734. His will is dated Nov. 7, 1733 and proved in Henrico December, 1734. It makes the following bequests: To son Francis all lands in Bermuda Hundred Neck reserving for wife Sarah the use of his house; also to Francis all land called Longfield, 908 acres; all land called Skinquarter, 5000 acres, and 3500 acres in Goochland near mountains; to son Richard 750 acres in Prince George; a tract called Winterpock Upper Quarter, 700 acres; 1000 acres bought from Cox; half of the land bought from Kennon, 1500 acres called Winterpock tract; Nut Tree 250 acres and 280 acres on Swift Creek; to son William 4950 acres in Henrico; the remainder to be divided between Richard and William. To daughter Anne 1200 acres in Goochland called Swan Creek; to daughter Martha the remainder of Swan Creek. To wife Sarah certain negroes. To daughters Martha and Ann other negroes and stock of cattle. To son Francis a large flowered tankard, one set of silver castors, one dozen silver spoons, one silver teapot, one small silver salver, one large silver soup spoon, "my silver hilted sword washed with gold" the scrutoir standing in the parlor made of black walnut with glass doors, pistols, holsters and certain negroes; to wife chaise and horses; to son Richard a silver can and a dozen silver spoons; to William, the same.

Issue: Francis V, died 1737, unmarried. Richard, of Chesterfield Co., 1715-1765; married Martha Bolling; William; Anne, married Benjamin Harris; Martha; 1712--1748 m. Llewellen Eppes, who died 1743, no issue; m 2nd 1746 John Wales. Their daughter Martha Wales married 1st in 1766 Bathurst Skelton who died in 1768; she then married Thomas Jefferson (later President of the U. S.) in 1772.

WILL OF SARAH EPPES, DECEASED @ HENRICO CO., VA.

In the name of God Amen, I, Sarah Eppes, being of sound mem-

ory and understanding and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, do make my last will and testament in the manner and form following, to the hands of Almighty God, hoping to receive Kingdom of Heaven and everlasting life. To my son Richard Eppes, 6 negroes viz. Sangston, Hanniball, Scipio, Dick, Judey and Pegg; to son William Eppes 1 dozen leather chairs, 1 oak table 1 walnut table and 2 pair Holland sheets and 1 silver tankard to contain 3 pints to be paid to my son Richard Eppes. To my daughter Ann Harris 1 negro girl named Chloe to her and her heirs forever; to grandson Joseph Harris 30 pounds currant money or a negro of that value to be paid him by my son Richard Eppes. To daughter Martha Wayles 1 mourning ring value 26 shillings. To the first son to be born to either of my sons, Richard or William Eppes that shall be named Francis, a mulatto slave named Tom. To son, Richard all residue of my estate. Executors son William and son Richard. 28 Feb. 1747 Witnesses Edmund Eppes, Littlebury. Royall. Will probated 1st Monday July 1748.

I Benjamin Harris of the Parrish of Southam in the County of Cumberland being Sick and Weak in Body but of a Perfect Sound and Disposing Memory and understanding do make, publish and declare this my Last Will and Testament in Manner and Form following; it is my Will and desire that I be buried at such Place as my Wife (hereafter mentioned) shall think proper. That there be no Funeral Sermon, that none of my children go into mourning and that there be no other useless or unnecessary expense at or about my said Funeral; that all my just debts be paid by my Executors hereafter mentioned hereby requiring and empowering them to sell any part of my said Estate either Real or Personal they think necessary for performing the same, and then I give to my truly deserving and most affectionate Wife all my other Estate of what kind or nature soever both real and personal to be by her disposed of amongst my children in such manner and at such time or times as she shall think proper and I hereby constitute and appoint my Dear and Loving Wife Ann Harris and Richard Eppes of the County of Chesterfield Gent. Executrix and Executor of this my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my Seal this fourth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and fifty seven.

This last Will and Testament of Benjamin Harris dec'd was presented in Court by Richard Eppes the Exor. therein named and the same was proved by the oath of Thomas Moody a Witness thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Exor. who made oath according to Law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form, giving security, on which he together with John Fleming and John Wayles his securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond according to Law, and Liberty is reserved to the Executrix therein named to join in probat.

WILL OF ANNE HARRIS, WIFE OF BENJAMIN HARRIS AND
 DAUGHTER OF COL. FRANCIS EPPES IV.

I, Ann Harris, of Southam Parish and County of Powhatan (Virginia) make the following testamentary disposition of my estate.

- I give my son Joseph and his heirs 400 acres of the tract of land whereon I live, meaning that the parcel that I sometime ago conveyed to him by deed shall be recovered, (illegible) part of the said 400 acres and that residue necessary to make up his complement be laid off adjoining to the said parcel already conveyed. I give my son Benjamin and his heirs 200 acres of the same tract to be laid off at the lower end thereof. I give my son Francis Eppes and his heirs 200 acres of the same tract to be laid off adjoining to the land he bought of Henry Skipwith, Esq. I give to my son ----- and his heirs 200 acres of the same tract, but if he dies before age ----- I give the same to my sons Edward, Benjamin, and Francis Eppes and their heirs, equally to be divided

among them in ----- I give to such of my daughters as shall not have been married at the time of my death 200 acres of the same tract, to include my dwelling house and outhouses thereto belonging, with 200 acres with the houses. It is my will they should hold jointly and undivided as long as they live single and when any of them marries or dies her interest to go over to the others or other remaining alive and single, and on the death or marriage of the last of them I will that the said 200 acres go to all my sons and their heirs equally to be divided among them; if on a resurvey of said tract of land there should be more or less than 1200 acres I will that the gain or loss be borne by several devisees in proportion to the quantity divided to them respectively. I confirm to my son Joseph the negro man called Peter which I have delivered to him during my life. I give to my son Edward an negro man Cesar; I give to my son Francis Eppes my negro boy Ludlow; I give to my son Richard my negro boy Jerry; I confirm to my daughter Mary a negro woman called Jenny and her children, whom I have delivered to her during my life. I give to my daughter Anne a negro woman Rose, and I give to my daughter Martha a negro woman called Doll. I give my daughter Tabitha a negro girl named Nancy. To my daughter Sarah and son Benjamin I have given no negroes especially because they already have some under gifts ----- which put them on an equal footing with their brothers and sisters. My horses and the rest of my slaves I give to be equally divided among my children Edward, Benjamin, Francis Eppes, Richard, Mary, Sarah, Anne, Martha and Tabitha, omitting in the bequest my son Joseph because independent of this my will he is better provided for than his brothers and sisters. The rest of my personal estate in which I mean to include all implements and crops shall first be applied to the payment of my debts and the residue thereof equally divided among such of my children as should not have been married at the time of my death. If any of my children die before twenty-one years of age, and also before marriage I will that the negroes and horses to which they are entitled under this my will shall fall unto the residuum of slaves and horses to be divided with them and their part of the residuum of personal estate in like fall into the residuum of personal estate given unto the unmarried children. Lastly I appoint my sons to be executors of my will hereby revoking all other wills by me hereby made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 15 day of May A. D. 1779. Witness William Daniel, Langhorn Tabb, Jacob McGehee, Charles Worsham. Probated 15 Nov. 1787.

LETTER FROM MRS. MARY JANE WHARTON BRUCKNER TO MRS. ELEANOR GILLESPIE.

Memphis, Tenn. Sept. 4, 1911

Dear Mrs. Gillespie:

Your second letter received. I remember your mother very distinctly now, having seen her once, and frequently having heard cousin Martha Spotswood speak of her. I presume your great-great grandfather was in the Revolutionary Army, as I have heard my grandfather, Richard Harris, say that his mother, who was a widow, sent all of her sons to the small-pox hospital to be inoculated that they might enter the army; otherwise they could not have done so. Vaccination had not been discovered then. I never heard the name of your great-great grandmother, all of the connection calling her Aunt Harris. I know nothing further back than Benjamin Harris. I heard Grandpa say that he fought against his first cousins, they being in the British Army and citizens of England. Sorry I can tell you nothing more.

P. S. Ann Harris was the daughter of Francis E. Harris, and suppose he was named for his uncle Francis Eppes. My grandfather had no middle name -- simply Richard Harris. John Richard Harris of Scottsboro was the son of Richard Benjamin Harris, who was a brother of my mother Eliza P. Harris. I failed to say that Ann Harris' mother was the wife of Francis Harris and the "Aunt Harris" spoken of before. I knew both cousin Gus Ford and his brother Dr. John Ford of Nashville well, having known Cousin Gus all my life, and being intimately associated with Dr. Ford's family while at school in Nashville. Was at Cousin Martha Mead's funeral when she died at her son's house near Nashville -- Coz. Gus. Mary B.

WILL OF JOHN P. STEGER, DECEASED

I, John P. Steger, of Madison County in the State of Alabama

do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say.

Item 1st: I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Steger, the northeast quarter of Section Thirteen in Township Three Range One East, to him and his heirs and hereby confirming the deed heretofore executed for said land to him and being the same on which he resides.

2nd. I give and bequeath to my son Allen Steger the Southwest Quarter of Section Thirteen in Township three, Range One East, to him and his heirs and hereby confirming the deed heretofore executed for said land to him, being the same on which he resides.

3rd. I give to my daughter Pamela Scruggs the negro girl slave named Lucy which she has in her possession.

4th: I give to my daughter Ann Steger a negro girl slave named Charlotte. I also give and bequeath to my said daughter Ann a negro girl named Mahala with her future increase, but she is not to have her or her profits until after the death of my wife unless my said wife shall before that time deliver said girl to her.

5th: I give to my daughter Sarah Cawthon a negro girl named Betsy which she now has in her possession.

6th: I give to my daughter Martha, a negro girl named Charity.

7th: I give to my daughter Mary a negro girl "Minerva".

8th: I give to my son Kennon Steger a negro boy named Davy. I also give to my said son Kennon a negro boy named Ned (son of Nancy) which said last named negro is not given to him as a legacy but in consideration of services rendered by my said son for which he is entitled to pay.

9th: I give to my son Francis Steger a negro boy named Arthur. I also after the death of my wife give and bequeath to my said son Francis his heirs and the home tract of land being the same whereon I now reside.

10th: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca for and during her natural life or widowhood, the tract of land and plantation whereon I now live together with all its appurtenances &c and all my live stock, plantation utensils household & kitchen furniture, and all my remaining slaves not hereinbefore disposed of and all my other property that may remain after paying my just debts, all which she is to have the use of during her life or widowhood but upon her death or marriage it is my will that all the property and effects hereby given or loaned to her be so divided by her among all my said children as well taken together with what I have given them, make them as nearly equal as can be the one with another in the amount of property given them, and I hereby authorize and request my said wife to make such division by will or otherwise as may result in doing justice to all my children and upon such terms and restrictions as her judgment may dictate.

11th: It is my will and I so request it to be done that if any of the specific legacies hereinbefore made should die before they respectively come into the possession, use or enjoyment of the

child to whom given my wife may out of the property herein given or loaned to her give to such child or children as may so lose their said legacies as much as well make up for such loss.

12th: It is my will that all my just debts be paid out of any property or available means other than the legacies hereinbefore given to my said children.

13th: The property mentioned and contained in Item 10th is intended for the support and maintenance of my said wife and such of my said children as may live with her, and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Rebecca Steger and my son Benjamin Steger Executrix and Executor of this my last will and testament.

Item 1: It is my will and desire that my Executors hereinafter to be named pay to my son, Benjamin Steger, the sum of \$250.00 and to my son Allen Steger the sum of \$5.00 as hereinafter directed, which with what they have respectively received under the will of their father will make their portions about equal to that of the other children hereinafter to be named.

Item 2: I give and bequeath to my sons Kennon H. Steger, and Francis E. H. Steger their heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Madison and State of Alabama, known and described as

The southeast quarter of Section 13, in township 3, and in range 1 east; and also one other adjoining tract known and described as the northeast quarter of Section 24, in township 3 and in Range 1 east being the north part of said quarter section, con-

veyed by deed of Mitchel and wife to Benjamin Steger, containing 160 acres known as the place on which I now reside to be equally divided between them in such manner as they may agree upon. The legacy of land above mentioned to my son Kennon H. Steger, being more than an equal portion with the other children, it is hereby intended to be in full of all money demands, and balances and in payment of the same, which I may now be owing or shall be owing him at the time of my death; and in full discharge of all and every claim which he may have against my Estate for monies advanced or services rendered by him in superintending the business of the plantation, since the death of his father. The devise of land made to my son Francis E. H. Steger as above stated, being the one half of the land before described, is hereby intended to be in full payment and discharge of all and every claim which the said Francis E. H. may have or set up against my estate for or on account of the sale of the tract of land desired to him by his father John P. Steger, known then as the home tract and being the same on which the said John P. Steger died.

Item 3: It is my will and desire that William R. Patton act as Trustee, and I hereby appoint him the said William R. Patton of the County and State aforesaid, trustee for and in behalf of my daughter Sally Cawthon, my grand daughter Martha Sophia Nash, the child of my daughter Martha Nash; and my three grand children by my daughter Mary P. Roach deceased, I have hereby nominated and appointed the said Trustee to take charge of the legacies to be hereinafter named in this will.

Item 4: I give and bequeath to William R. Patton, Trustee as aforesaid, the following named negro slaves;

Betsey a girl about 27 years old,
 Mat a boy about 19 years of age,
 Lucy a girl about 18 years of age

to be held in trust for the sole and separate use and benefit of my said daughter Sally R. Cawthon and her children, and upon the death of the said Sally R. Cawthon to be equally divided among her children.

Item 5: It is my will and desire that Sam a man slave about 50 years of age, and Joe a man slave about 48 years of age be sold by my executors hereinafter to be named, and the proceeds thereof to be paid over to William R. Patton, Trustee as aforesaid for the use and benefit of my grand daughter Martha Sophia Nash and to be by him retained, and so managed, as best to promote her interest and in the event of her death without issue it is my will and desire, that the said Trustee, shall pay over this said sum of money with all such interest as may have accrued thereon, to all my children hereinbefore named, an equal portion

of the same to share and share alike, to be received and held in the manner as the legacies hereinbefore given, are received and held.

Item 6: It is my will and desire, that Charity a girl about 25 years of age, Matilda a girl nine years of age, and Hervey a boy 5 years of age, all my negro slaves, be sold by my executors hereinafter to be named, and the proceeds thereof to be paid over to William R. Patton trustee as aforesaid for the use and benefit of my grand children the children of my daughter Mary P. Roach, to be by him retained and so managed as best to promote their interest until they become of age or marry respectively and then to be equally divided between them, share and share alike.

Item 7: I will and bequeath to my grand children the children of my daughter Permelia Scruggs, the following negro slaves: Lucy a girl about 10 years of age, Mary a woman about 48 years of age, Albert a boy about 8 years of age, Bob a boy about 5 years of age, to be equally divided among them, my said grand children if practicable otherwise to be sold by my Executors; and the money equally divided among my said grand children, the first named negro girl Lucy having been received by my daughter Pamelia in the lifetime of her father. It is my will and desire that after my death (should I not do so before that time) that my Executors deliver to my daughter Ann M. Stevenson, the negro girl named Charlotte and her children and the negro woman Mahala and her children being the same left to her by the will of her father, and subject to be retained in my possession during my life.

Item 8: It is my will and desire that my executors sell my negro slaves Peter and Daniel after my death, in such manner and on such terms as they think best and out of the proceeds thereof pay to my son Benjamin Steger the sum of \$250.00 as hereinbefore directed and to William R. Patton, Trustee as aforesaid, \$100.00 for the use and benefit of my grand daughter Martha Sophia Nash to be retained and applied by him in the same manner as hereinbefore directed, in regard to the legacy for her before mentioned in this my will and the further sum of \$150.00 to be paid by my Executors to William R. Patton Trustee as aforesaid for the use and benefit of my daughter Sally R. Cawthon to be retained and applied by him in the same manner as hereinbefore directed in regard to the legacy for her and her children before mentioned in this my will and the balance of the proceeds of such sale to be applied by my executors to the payment of all my just debts.

Item 9: It is my will and desire that my Executors after my death sell all my perishable property not herein given away of all kinds except my linen and bed clothes, which I desire to have equally distributed among my daughters that may be living at the time

of my death; said sale to be for cash or on credit as my executors may think best and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided between my daughter Sally R. Cawthon and my three grand children, the children of my deceased daughter Mary F. Roach to be paid over to the said William R. Patton, Trustee as aforesaid, and to be held by him as hereinbefore directed in regard to their other bequests and legacies mentioned in a former part of this will. The foregoing legacies and bequests have been made to my children and grand children with what they have heretofore received, with the view of making their portions as nearly equal as possible, according to Item 10. It is my will and desire in the event of the death of the said William R. Patton or other inability to act as Trustee as directed, and appointed in this will, that his brother John Patton and William Acklen act in his stead either one or both of them, with all the powers conferred in this will upon the said William R. Patton, Trustee as aforesaid, and all the obligations imposed. And lastly: having full confidence in the honesty and ability of William R. Patton and William Acklen I do hereby constitute and appoint them my lawful executors to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every clause thereof.

The residue of my negroes not above named I give to my three sons, Daniel, Henry and Kennon Harris, together with all my household and kitchen furniture, stock of all kinds, including every particle of property that I am now possessed of, that is not named as above, to be equally divided among them, & lastly I appoint my sons, Daniel, Henry and Kennon Harris my executors to this my last Will and Testament, revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made, whereunto I have hereunto set my hand this fifteenth day of April, 1828.

I will and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Reece one negro woman named Cate and her four children to her and her children only also one bed and furniture, all of which she has heretofore received.

I will and bequeath unto my grandson J. P. Powell, the son of my deceased son, Levin Powell at the death of my wife or as soon as she may change her widowhood the said five negroes (viz) Sam and Amy and Amy's three children and her further increase this last mention negro is the same that I have heretofore will to my wife during her life or widowhood if my wife shall die or change her widowhood before my grandson J. P. Powell shall arrive at full age, I will that Levin Powell the son of my son J. P. Powell shall receive the said five negroes Sam, Amy and her children in trust for my grandson J. P. Powell and deliver it with increase to him when he the said J. P. Powell, when he becomes of age if the said J. P. Powell shall die before he becomes of full age, I will and bequeath unto the aforesaid Levin Powell the said negroes Sam and Amy & Amy's children in his own right and title absolutely.

I also will and bequeath unto my daughter Francis Eldridg and her children only one negro woman named Easter and one boy named Henry, also one bed and furniture which she has already received. FRANCIS EPPES HARRIS was born about 1750 in Virginia. Dr. F. E. H. Steger, in his sketch of the family states: "He was of wealthy parentage. During his scholastic days he was a hard student, acquiring an ample fund of varied and useful knowledge, indispensable to the performance of duties laid before him by Thomas Jefferson, for whom he was acting as secretary at Monticello (NOTE. Thomas Jefferson's wife was Ann Eppes Harris' niece). Later he returned to his home and began agricultural pursuits. His home was crowned with peace and plenty and social commingling of the most elegant and refined society. His body was adapted to endurance and longevity. He was a little over six feet tall, fair complexioned, gray eyes, a manly form, erect, strong, quiet, and active. His weight was about a hundred and eighty pounds. An accidental tumble downstairs occasioned a shock which ended his life". He came to Madison Co. Ala. in 1809 (made deed in Va. Oct. 12, 1808, and first land grant in Madison Co. Ala. Aug. 10, 1809, a few days after the Land Office placed the Madison Co. lands on sale.)

McAllister's Virginia Militia, page 222 shows, among those from Fowhatan Co., who served in the Revolution was Francis E. Harris,

Ensign A. May 21, 1778 under E. Dunford.

Dr. F. E. A. Steger stated that his wife was a Macon. See Macon Notes. He died in Madison Co. Ala. Dec. 1828 (see will) and is said to be buried in an unmarked grave in the old Harris family cemetery near Chase, Ala.

JOHN PEYTON POWELL was born in Loudon Co., Va. Feb. 28, 1760. He was married Oct. 13, 1783 (date of marriage bond) to Tabitha Harris, daughter of Benjamin and Anne (Exes) Harris in Powhatan County, Va. She died between 1800 and 1807, when he married Elizabeth Biscoe. Bond signed by Francis E. Harris. They moved from Powhatan Co., Va. to Madison Co., Ala. about 1810. He married 3rd Ann H. who outlived him. (See his will) He is buried on the old home place near Hazel Green, Ala. Tombstone inscriptions: Peyton Powell, born Feb. 28, 1760, died June 23, 1844. Elizabeth Biscoe, wife of Peyton Powell, born April 23, 1769, died June 3, 1834. Census of Military Pensioners states he was 80 years old in 1840.

From papers in Revolutionary War Records S. 46407 "it appears that Peyton Powell or John Peyton Powell in his 14th year entered in March, 1777 as a cadet in Capt. Johnson's Co. of the 11th Va. Regiment. Four or five months later, he was commissioned Ensign and in the Winter of 1779 and 1780 was commissioned Lieutenant. Captured when Charleston, S. C. surrendered exchanged in 1781, re-joined the army and served as Capt. of the 1st Regiment of Va. line until the end of the Revolution. Allowed pension on his application executed July 3, 1828 while living in Madison Co., Ala. He stated he was married to a relative of Mrs. Jefferson's but did not give her name or any further data in regard to her and it is not stated whether they had any children."

Obituary of Richard Harris, deceased.

"Another Revolutionary soldier gone. Died in Madison Co., Ala. Jan. 2, 1853, Capt. Richard Harris. The deceased was born in Powhatan Co., Va. on the 20th Nov., 1758. When but a youth, at the age of 17, he entered the army, and with that veteran band of soldiers, fighting for liberty and truth, devoted himself to his country's interests till the close of the war. He was an eyewitness of the surrender of Lord Cornwallis at Little York. After having shared with his countrymen the hardships of war, he returned to his home and friends to enjoy that glorious boon, liberty, for which he had so earnestly contended. Soon after the war he devoted himself to the service of God and the good of his fellowmen. He professed religion in Powhatan Co., Va. and soon after reunited himself with the Methodist Church, where he remained for more than half a century a consistent, useful and much loved member-hospitable, kind, generous; you had only to look upon his noble face to behold all those commanding and ennobling virtues, which adorn human nature. He removed from Va. to Madison Co., Ala. in 1809 and resided near Blue Spring till the day of his death. We do not say he was without fault, but we do say that few men have lived as long as he did with as few censurers and with as few enemies. He closed his earthly warfare as he closed the Revolutionary War, in triumph and glory. He has left many friends to mourn his loss. -- "Southern Advocate", Huntsville, Ala. Feb. 9, 1853.

Richard Harris was the son of Benjamin Harris and Ann Erpes. He was born in Virginia and died in Madison County, Ala. where he is buried beside his wife in the family graveyard near Mastin's Lake. He married in Cumberland Co., Va. gilt knee buttons"; one for a "metallic case" from the undertaker, \$61.25; from the printer for "funeral tickets" and one for "tombstones for Richard Harris and wife."

STEGER NOTES

Extracts from letters from Isaac Allen Steger,
of Richmond, Va.

"Francis George Steger went to Gorchland Co. (Va.) in 1742; this is the first record of a Steger in that county. I have advice that Stegers were landowners in Amelia County, which joined Powhatan prior to 1732."

"I was in Amelia, but did not get any information that would help me as to whom Francis George Steger married, and when he first came to Virginia. I found in Amelia a deed to Henrich Hans Steger, 1750, also I find he left valuable bonds and papers in a bank in Southwark, Surry County, England. He owned a number of houses in St. Anne's Lane in ye Parish of St. John. By fol-

lowing this up I might find that Francis George Steger came from the same place. Henrich Hans Steger married Tralucia Ginn in England. This all recorded in Amelia. Tralucia Ginn was the daughter of William Ginn of St. Anne's Lane; that is the way they got the houses. Henrich Hans Steger and Tralucia had two children, William Hans and Tralucia. Tralucia married Greensword and was a widow before her father's death. It is about fifteen miles over into Powhatan to where Francis George Steger settled."

"I notice what you say about John Ferratt Steger marrying Rebekah Harris; I saw a letter at Powhatan from Frank E. Harris to the clerk to please issue license to John Ferratt Steger Junr. to marry his daughter Rebekah Harris. The return license was attached. That was the 11th day of May, 1796. Some of the Steger girls married Harris for Father talked about a favorite cousin named Joe Harris."

The first record of the Stegers that I have been able to find so far in Virginia was in February 12, 1742. Francis George Steger received a land grant of 400 acres on Muddy Creek in what was then Goochland County, before Powhatan County was formed.

This grant was made by King George direct to Francis George Steger. In all there were four grants of land to Francis Steger.

He seemed to have taken up his residence in what was then Goochland County (now Powhatan) directly after this land grant in 1742.

From the information I get from the deeds the family finally acquired up to the year 1800, something like fifteen or twenty thousand acres of land in Powhatan and Cumberland counties. These two counties were cut off from Goochland County. This land was between Deep Creek, Muddy Creek and Willis River. The Postoffice at that time was Trenholm.

John Wayles turned over to Francis G. Steger his land grant of two acres or four lots in the Town of Richmond, Henrico County, Virginia, They were on the southwest side of Main Street near the corner of a stone chimney which he owned.

Francis G. Steger was assigned an Island in the James River, opposite Coles Warehouse.

THOMAS HALES STEGER and his mother sold the old plantation in Powhatan County about 1857 and moved to Franklin County, Virginia. Thomas Hales Steger died February and was buried in Fairview Cemetery in Roanoke, Virginia.

Isham Steger's sale was on November 29, 1845. This was of such property as was not left to the widow and to Thomas Hales, who expected to remain at the home place.

Isham Steger cut off 100 acres of his land for John Ferratt Steger and Daniel Steger.

I find that John Ferratt Steger Jr. married Rebekah Harris, daughter of Frank E. Harris on May 11, 1796.

You will also note that Sarah Steger married James Cook and I understand they afterwards located somewhere in Tennessee. This marriage was prior to Isham Steger's death on June 17, 1845.

The military records of Cumberland County show that Hance Steger and Thomas Steger, brothers of John Ferratt Steger, Sr. were Lieutenants in the War of 1776 under Captain Mayo.

Isham Steger was given by his father John Ferratt Steger, Sr. 185 acres of land on Deep Creek in Powhatan County. It was cut off his plantation.

I have been very much interested in trying to find the name of Francis G. Steger's wife, the only name I have been able to find is Anna Jannett, which is no doubt her given name.

Another thing that interested me was the name of John Ferratt for three generations, just as the entire family has carried the name of Thomas Hale. I was unable to find out why these two names appeared in the family.

STEGER NOTES, WILLIAM SHEPARD, OF GUINEA MILLS, VA.

From Book of Strattons, Vol. 11, page 27. James F. Stratton married Mary Stegar, Nov. 7, 1807, daughter of Capt. John F. Stegar, elsewhere referred to as "of Revolutionary fame." The tradition here is that Mary Netherland Steger, wife of F. B. Stratton, was a daughter of Hantz Steger, who married Ann Ferrott. I believe Amelia Co. Records might give some detail, but they yet have to be investigated Since writing a former letter I have seen the oldest descendant of the Stratton family who says without suggestion from anyone, or access to papers, that the following is true: Hantz Steger married Lucy Ginn and had children by two marriages she thinks. His son Hantz Steger married Ann Ferrott and ran off with her to America, his father already here. The family was Alsatian, all merchants, and went to Holland after the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes thence to England. Hantz popular name in the family because was name of a noble (Von) ancestor. Hantz and Ann (Ferrott) Steger had a daughter (youngest child, and there were many) Mary Netherland Steger born 1764., married 1787 Peter Baugh Stratton; they had one son named Hantz Ginn Stratton. She is positive that Hantz Steger and Ann Ferrott were parents of Mary.

Francis Steger, married Anna Jannett. ----- He died 1769 (see will) Their son John Farrott Steger, married about 1765 (oldest child Francis Steger, born 1766). Sarah Harris. Their son John Ferratt Steger, Jr. Married Rebecca Macon Harris, 1796.

We have absolute proof of every statement except that Francis Steger was a son of Hantz Steger and wife Ann Ferrott. We believe that he was, because: 1. The continued recurrence of the names Ferrott and Hantz or Hance in the family, even to the present generation.

2. There is a tradition in every branch of the Steger family that a Steger in England married an heiress against her father's will and that she was a Farrott; they then came to Virginia. This tallies with the story told in the Shepard notes. One descendant, Mrs. Julia Von Manston, stated that the old family silver is said to have been engraved with a parrot; in his history of Madison County, Judge Thomas Taylor referred to John F. Steger, Jr. as "Parrot Steger" showing the common pronunciation of the name.

3. Dates make this theory a possibility. And we find dates are the best way in which to check all genealogical material.

Susan Jane Parks was the daughter of John Whiten Parks (son of William Parks and wife Jane Whiten of S. C. and Blount Co.,) and Sarah Sharp, daughter of Alexander Sharp and Susanna Maxwell (she the daughter of Robert Maxwell of Blount Co. and his wife, Sarah.....) Alexander Sharp was the son of Robert Sharp, killed by the Indians in Knox Co., Tenn, 1792, and his wife (probably a cousin) Letitia Sharp, daughter of John Sharp Sr. of Augusta Co., Va. and his wife Ann Boyd. (See Chalkey's Abstracts of Augusta Co.,) John Sharp, Sr. served in the Battle of the Brandywine. (Goodspeed's History of East Tenn., page 1102)

James Samuel Paul married in Madison Co. Ala. Jan, 1893 Lillian Bone, daughter of Dr. H. F. Bone, C. S. A. and Louisa Ann Walker, H. F. Bone was son of Rev. M. H. No. 204331) Louisa Ann Walker is the daughter of James Walker of Monroe Co., Miss and Mary Jane Jordan; he the son of William Walker and Jane Lemant (DAR No. 204331), he the son of John Walker Sr. Chester Co., S. C. (DAR No. 204331) and she the daughter of James Lemant (killed at Battle of Monck's Corners) and wife Martha Lemant of Chester Co., S. C. (DAR No. 204331 on both.) Littlebury Mosely's company, Col. Call's Virginia Troop of Horse and was in the Battle of Petersburg. He enlisted in 1781 and served six weeks, officers not stated. He collected cattle and drove them to Yorktown. (See DAR Nos. 204332, 13800).

He married 1st Martha Markham, whose only child, Bernard Bentley, died at the age of ten.

WILBURN FAMILY

Cemetery Records. Three miles south of Madison Cross Roads, Madison County, Ala. The land passed out of the hands of the family many years ago, and a later owner took the stones from the graves, using some of them in the foundation of the house; and the rest were laid face down for a walk, and had to be turned over before the inscriptions could be copied. Moved to Buckingham Co. and settled just prior to his death in Cumberland, where his will was dated Apr. 26, 1788. Mentions wife, son Drury, grandson Finch Scruggs and others. After the death of this first wife, Thomas Scruggs went to Scott Co., Ky. with his five grown children 1793-4 and gave to each adjoining tracts of land near Lindsay Sta. about 12 miles from Frankfort. He returned to Va. from Ky. prior to 1798, and was married to Jane, daughter of Walter Scott of Bedford Co. Issue by her: Reaves Scott Scruggs, born Nov. 1799; Richard Mitchell Scruggs, born 1802; Thomas Scruggs' will dated Nov. 17, 1801, probated Bedford Co., Va. Oct. 22, 1804 leaves real and personal estate to wife Jane. Exr. son Gross Scruggs and wife, Jane Scruggs.

GROSS SCRUGGS born in Va. 1769 went to Ky. with his father and brothers but did not remain. He finally settled in Madison Co., Ala. on a large plantation near Huntsville (where his home still stands, in a dilapidated condition). It is said he caused quite a sensation upon his arrival in Ala. as he came in his coach-and-four with outriders. He married 1st in Bedford Co., Va. May 31, 1792 Nancy Logwood. 2nd in Bedford Co. Oct. 17, 1805 Mary (Polly) Tate, who died Sept. 19, 1832. 3rd, in Ala. Mary Saunders, widow of Wm. Jones; 4th, Edith, widow of Reuben Shotwell.

JONES FAMILY

GEORGE TANNAHILL JONES, father of George Washington Jones who married Maria Gay Harris, was born in S. C. Oct. 10, 1790.

It is apparent that he lived for a time in Morgan County, Ga. and Bedford Co., Tenn., before coming to Madison County, about 1815; He was married Dec. 10, 1812, probably in Bedford Co.,

Tenn. to Rebecca Campbell Brown, (The Bedford Co. records, excepting the deeds) were burned in 1865. She was born in Tennessee, Feb. 26, 1796, and died in Madison County, Ala. Oct. 20, 1873.

George Tannahill Jones settled near New Market, Ala., where he was a prominent citizen until his death May 4, 1871. He was a justice of the peace in 1818. He was three times elected to the Alabama State Legislature, and was one of the commissioners who built the court house begun at Huntsville in 1835 and (since replaced).

His mother, who was Miss Jones, married Andrew Tannahill in South Carolina, probably Edgefield District, about 1789. She died at the birth of her son George, who was taken by his Jones grandparents, reared by them and assumed their name, being known as George T. Jones. Some time after he was grown his father, while on a visit, suggested that he go back to his own name, but as everyone knew him as Jones, to avoid the confusion, he did not do it. Andrew Tannahill was born Nov. 14, 1767 and died Nov. 11, 1835, in Sangamon Co., Ill. here he and his second wife Celia and a number of their children were members of the Salem Sugar Creek Baptist Church. CRINER FAMILY

Edward Harris came to Madison Co., Ala. from Amherst Co., Va. and died in 1832. His wife was Catharine Digges, who died Feb. 14, 1855 aged 77.

It appears from the foregoing that there were four William W. Harrises here about the same time; the father of Frederick Harris, who was dead before 1829; his brother William W. who was apparently alive at the time the will was made (1829); the William W. who died Nov. 1825 leaving a widow Sarah; and the William W. who married Mary Ann Lewis in 1819, and who seems to be the same one who was dead 1827. None of these can be identified, at this time; as the William W. Harris who married Mary Jane Sale, daughter of Dudley Sale, died in Limestone County several years after the Civil War.

MACON FAMILY

Dr. Francis Eppes Harris Steger, in his history of the family, written just a few years before his death, states that "he (Francis Eppes Harris) married Miss Mary Macon, a sister of Nathaniel Macon, one of our wise, honest U. S. Senators she lived serenely calm and dignified until her death at 72 years of age."

Sketch of Kennon Harris Steger, Owens History of Alabama, page 1861. "In 1806 he (Francis Eppes Harris) and wife Mary Macon, daughter of Nathaniel Macon, moved with their family and goods by caravan across the mountains from Virginia to Alabama."

We have tried in every possible way to prove this Macon connection, but so far have not been successful. We have proved to our satisfaction that Francis Eppes Harris, wife was named Ann, instead of Mary, as is shown by the following deeds from Powhatan Co., Va. Deed Book 3, page 47. Francis E. Harris and wife Ann deed land to Richard Harris and wife Judith, Dec. 15, 1796. Witnessed by John F. Steger, Jr. and Wm. Steger. This instrument speaks of Ann Harris, Richard's mother, her daughter Mary, son Richard and their four brothers.

Deed Book 1, page 92 Benjamin Harris received land from Francis E. Harris. 1778.

July 20, 1780 Ann Harris to son Francis Epp Harris, land

July 19, 1780, Ann Harris to son Richard

June 15, 1785, Ann Harris to Richard her son. Witnessed by Francis Eppes Harris Thomas Branch and Francis Steger.

Dec. 22, 1787, Francis E. Harris and Ann his wife, deed of sale to Thomas Coverly.

Mar. 17, 1786, Francis Epp Harris and wife Ann to

Oct. 12, 1808, Francis E. Harris and wife Ann convey land to John Peyton Powell, Jr.

She was not a daughter of Nathaniel Macon; "Life of Nathaniel Macon" states he was born in 1757 in Warren Co., N.C., married Hannah Plummer after the Revolutionary War, died in Warren Co. 29th of June, 1837. He survived his two daughters, one of whom married William Martin Esq. of Granville, the other William Eaton, Esq. of Warren. We have no list of the brothers and sisters of Nathaniel Macon save the following letter from Mrs. Blanche Bentley of McMinnville, Tenn., a very able genealogist; "This record of the Macon family was given me many years ago by a daughter of Captain John Macon of Warren Co. (Tenn.) The Macon family of Virginia claim French descent. Gideon Macon located first in New Kent Co., Va., and

later removed to Isle of Wight Co. Martha, sister of Gideon Macon (II) married Orlando Jones and was grandmother of Martha Custis. Gideon Macon (II) married Friscilla, daughter of Edmund Jones and his wife Abigail Ligon, all of Isle of Wight Co., removed to Warren Co., N.C. and had issue: Ann Hunt Macon, married Captain John Alston; Sarah Macon, married Captain John Hawkins; Martha Macon married Joseph Sewell; John Macon married 1st Joanna Tabb, 2nd Elizabeth Williams; Harrison Macon married Hannah Glenn; Nathaniel Macon married Hannah Plummer; Gideon Hunt Macon married 1st Mary Green, 2nd Mary Hartwell.

John Macon, (son of Gideon II) and wife Elizabeth Williams had issue: Harrison Macon, married Margaret Brooks. Nathaniel Macon, no information.

Harrison Macon and wife Margaret Brooks removed to Warren Co., Tenn. and had issue: Captain John Macon, 35th Tenn. Regt. C.S.A. married Martha Ramsey; Joseph Macon married Elizabeth Lewis; Harrison Macon married Frances Seward; Nancy Macon married Cunningham; Mary Friscilla Macon married Duckworth; Richard Macon, married Stiles.

As you will note, this shows Senator Nathaniel Macon's sister Ann married Captain John Alston.

We believe that Francis Eppes Harris wife was a Macon, or closely kin to them; although we feel we must present all the data we have; William & Mary Quarterly, Oct. 1927; Marriage Bonds of Cumberland Co. Francis Harris and Ann Diuguid, June 7, 1773. Signed Frans. Harris, Thompson Swann. Fowhatan Co., Va. Deed Book 3, Page 83, Anne Diuguid deeds her daughter Anne Harris of Buckingham Co. a negro girl, Feb. 27, 1802. Test. Alex. Diuguid and George E. Diuguid. Deed Book 3, page 82. Anne Diuguid, deed of gift to granddaughter Anne Mimms a negro girl. Feb. 7, 1802. Tes. Francis Harris, Alex. Diuguid, George E. Diuguid and Reuben Mims. Goochland Co., Va. Marriages -- Nov. 25, 1745. William Diuguid to Anne Moss; Sec. Constant Perkins, Wit. Jas. Meredith. Certificate of consent from Alexander Moss. Wit. Francis A. Moss and Joshu Barnes.

The marriage date, 1773, is about right for our Francis E. Harris and wife Ann but the fact that this Francis Harris has no E. in his signature is almost proof that it is another man; we have never found it omitted from the name of our ancestor. Dr. F. E. H. Steger stated that he "was born in Buckingham County"-- in fact places them all in Buckingham, though tomb-

stones and county records show Cumberland and Fowhatan. He may have lived in Buckingham for a time.

Our chief reasons for belief that Francis E. Harris' wife was a Macon, beyond Dr. Steger's statement, is the recurrence of the name in the family. She had a daughter Rebecca Macon Harris, a son Henry Macon Harris; and her son Daniel Harris named a daughter Rebecca Mayo Harris. Children were seldom named for people other than close relatives. While we cannot prove it, we believe she was daughter of Henry Macon and his first wife, Rebecca Mayo. Henry Macon's will, Cumberland Co., Va. 29 Oct. 1783- 24 Oct. 1785 mentions only, wife; Pleasants Woodson, son of John Tucker, sons William and John. This does not positively prove that these two were his only children, for we find a great many old wills which name only a part of the children of a very large family; sometimes they had already received their share; and if the girls had married well to do men, the estate usually went to the sons. We also have the will of Ann (Ferratt) Mayo (Mother of Rebecca Mayo, first wife of Henry Macon) dated January 29, 1769, codiciled January 27, 1770, proved Dec. 27, 1773. In it she mentions son Joseph; grandson Daniel Mayo, granddaughter Mary Macon, granddaughter Ann Macon; daughter-in-law Ann Carrington (wife of Col. George Carrington); grandson William Mayo, son of John; grandson John Mayo, son of John; granddaughter Mary Ann Mayo, ...

This granddaughter Ann Macon may have been a daughter of Henry Macon and Rebecca Mayo, and she may be the Ann ... who married Francis Eppes Harris. This is conjecture and needs further research.

Some of the North Carolina Macon family came to Madison County many years ago, and "claimed kin" with the family of Francis Eppes Harris. There is no doubt of a Macon kinship but we cannot say just where it is.

Other Macon Notes.

Life of Nathaniel Macon by Wm. E. Dodd states that Gideon Macon was a prominent planter and vestryman of St. Peter's Parish, New Kent, Co., Va. His estate "Prospect Hill" was inherited by his son William Macon, born 1693, also a vestryman and Colonel of the New Kent Militia. William's sister Martha married Col. Orlando Jones
